



Endowed Scholarship Awards

Scholarships are available to graduating Girl Scouts who will attend an institute of higher learning. Scholarships are credited directly to the institute of higher learning. Only one application is required, applicants will be considered for all scholarships.

Barbara Glazier Bernhardt Scholarship

The Barbara Glazier Bernhardt Scholarship was established in 1986 by Robert Bernhardt, honoring Barbara as past chair of the Board of Directors and as a lifelong Girl Scout. To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must demonstrate academic excellence and actively participate in Girl Scout and non-Girl Scout community activities. Completion of a Highest Award is preferred, but not required.

Patti Belcourt Scholarship Fund

The Patti Belcourt Scholarship was established in 2016 by Patti Belcourt, a dedicated troop leader, Gold Award Committee member, volunteer and supporter of the Girl Scout mission. To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must be a current resident of Union County and must demonstrate academic excellence and a commitment to community service. Completion of the Girl Scout Gold Award is preferred, but not required.

Norma Cannon Scholarship

The Norma Cannon Scholarship was endowed in memory of Norma Cannon by her children. Ms. Cannon was a lifelong supporter of Girl Scouts and its mission to help girls develop their leadership potential. To qualify for this scholarship, girls must be a resident of Cabarrus County and must demonstrate academic excellence. Completion of the Girl Scout Gold Award is preferred, but no required.

The Harper Family Scholarship

The Harper Family Scholarship was endowed in honor of Bert Harper, Board President from 2001-2010, by several colleagues at Bank of America. To qualify for this scholarship, an applicant must have completed her Gold Award and must demonstrate academic excellence and a commitment to community service.

Betty Lynn Lambert Scholarship

The Betty Lynn Lambert Scholarship was endowed in honor of Betty Lynn Lambert, Board President from 1993-2000, by her daughter, Katherine. To qualify for this scholarship, an applicant must have been a member of Girl Scouts for the past five years and have received her Gold Award. She must also demonstrate academic excellence and a commitment to community service.

Robert W. Maidt, Jr. Memorial Scholarship

The Robert W. Maidt, Jr. Memorial Scholarship was endowed in memory of Bob Maidt by his wife, Michelle Maidt. Michelle is a member of the Girl Scout Council of Advisors and Ambassadors and a former Board member, as well as one of the founders of the Carolina Girl Scout Foundation. To qualify for this scholarship, an applicant must have been an active Girl Scout member for at least four years and shown a strong commitment to community service. Applicants must also demonstrate financial need.

Marie McLucas Scholarship

The Marie McLucas Scholarship was endowed in honor of Marie McLucas by her employer, Primax Properties. Marie McLucas has served our council as Treasurer and Chair of the Finance and Fund Development Committees. To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must be a resident of Cabarrus County and must demonstrate academic excellence and strong involvement in Girl Scouts and her community. Completion of the Girl Scout Gold Award is preferred, but not required.

Jenny Zartman Memorial Scholarship

The Jenny Zartman Memorial Scholarship was established in honor of Jenny Zartman in 2007. Jenny's life was tragically cut short in 2006 and this scholarship was established in her memory by her family and friends. To qualify for this scholarship, an applicant must have been awarded her Gold Award and must demonstrate academic excellence and a commitment to community service.

The Girl Scouts, Hornets' Nest Sisterhood Scholarship

The Girl Scouts, Hornets' Nest Scholarship was established in 2021 to honor those who exemplify what it means to be a sister to every Girl Scout. To qualify for this scholarship, applicants must demonstrate academic achievement and commitment to community service preferably with a multicultural or racial justice, diversity, equity and inclusion focus.
