## **ADMISSION AND PARKING**

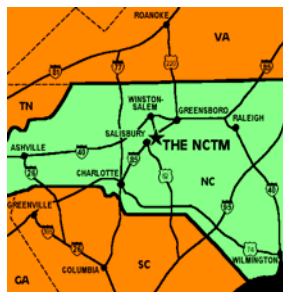
General admission to the museum and grounds is free, though donations are appreciated. Admission may be charged for special events and train rides. Please park in one of the two parking lots located on the north end of the museum property near the Barber Junction.

## DIRECTIONS

The museum is located on Highway 29 in Spencer, NC near exit 79 on I-85. The museum entrance is at the North end of the museum across from 1<sup>st</sup> Street. Coming from exit 79, follow the brown NCTM signs. The entrance is on the left.

Busses may unload at Barber Junction Depot (yellow building) adjacent to the main parking lot. Bus parking is in the main parking lot, opposite Barber Junction.

- **From Albemarle:** Take 52 North to I-85. I-85 North to exit 79. Turn left at the exit, and left at the next stop sign. Make a left at the second stoplight. The museum is on your left.
- **From Charlotte:** Take I-85 North to exit 79. Turn left at the exit, and left at the next stop sign. Make a left at the second stoplight. The museum is on your left.
- **From Greensboro:** Take I-85 South to exit 79. Turn right at the exit. Make a left at the second stoplight. The museum is on your left.
- **From Salisbury:** Head North on Main Street. Go through downtown Spencer and pass through three stoplights (6<sup>th</sup> Street, 5<sup>th</sup> Street, 4<sup>th</sup> Street). The museum entrance is on the right across from 1<sup>st</sup> Street.
- **From Statesville:** Take I-40 to I-77 South. Take exit 49A (G. Bagnal Blvd, which is Highway 70). South on Highway 70 for 21.5 miles to the Salisbury Mall. Turn right at Jake Alexander Blvd. Continue on Jake Alexander Blvd, taking the exit for US 29 (Main Street). Make a right at the stoplight, and proceed on Main Street through Salisbury and into Spencer. The museum will be on your right.
- **From Winston Salem:** Take 52 South to I-85. I-85 South to exit 79. Turn right at the exit. Make a left at the second stoplight. The museum is on your left.

## ACCESSIBILITY

The North Carolina Transportation Museum is fully accessible to people with disabilities. Wherever possible, access to exhibits is facilitated by wheelchair lifts and staff. Certain exhibits and programs do have limited accessibility due to narrow door openings on railroad passenger cars. For additional details, please contact the museum.

## SCHEDULING A GROUP VISIT

- All groups must be pre-registered with two weeks advance notice.
- Train ride costs for eligible groups:
  - \$1.50 each for pre-K - 12<sup>th</sup> grade and teachers
  - \$3.00 each for parent chaperones
- A group reservation will be made for groups of 15 or more
- If a group arrives with less than 15 people, they must pay for full fare per person.
- Turntable rides are .50 for scheduled groups, and \$1.00 for general public.

Please allow a minimum of 2 hours to visit the museum.
